Seniority leading procedure, not always competence leading procedure

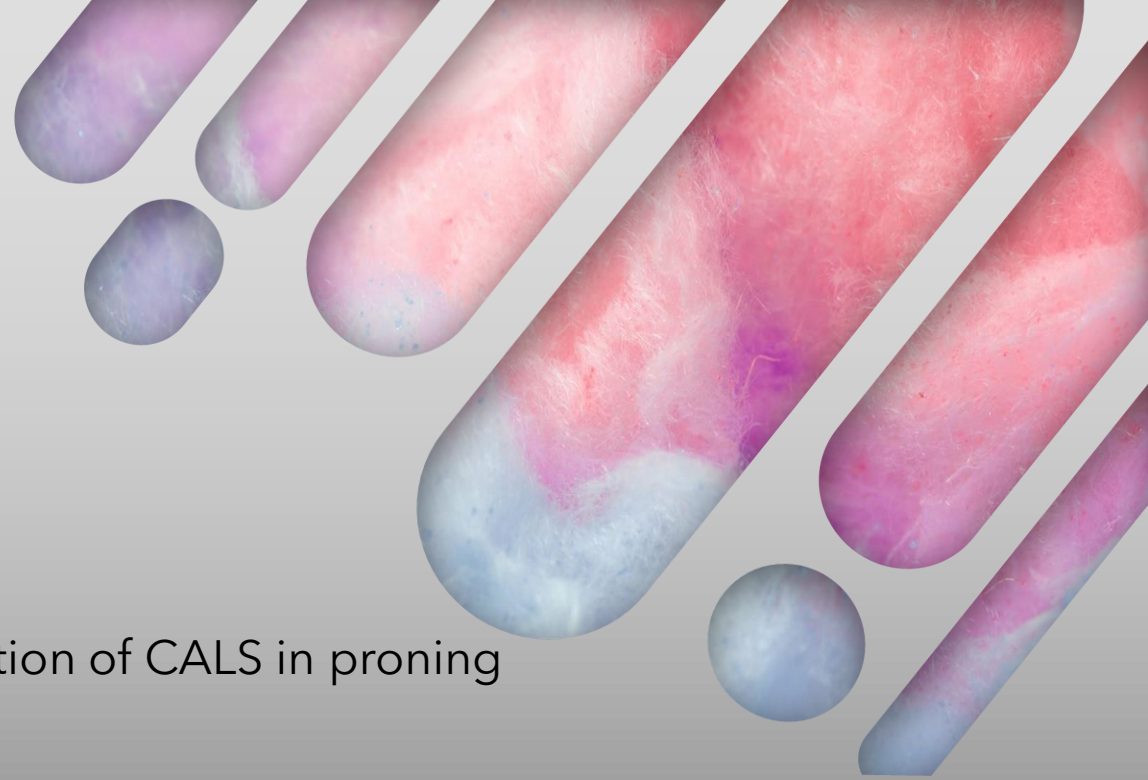

Pre change data collection on the occurrence of proning within CICU



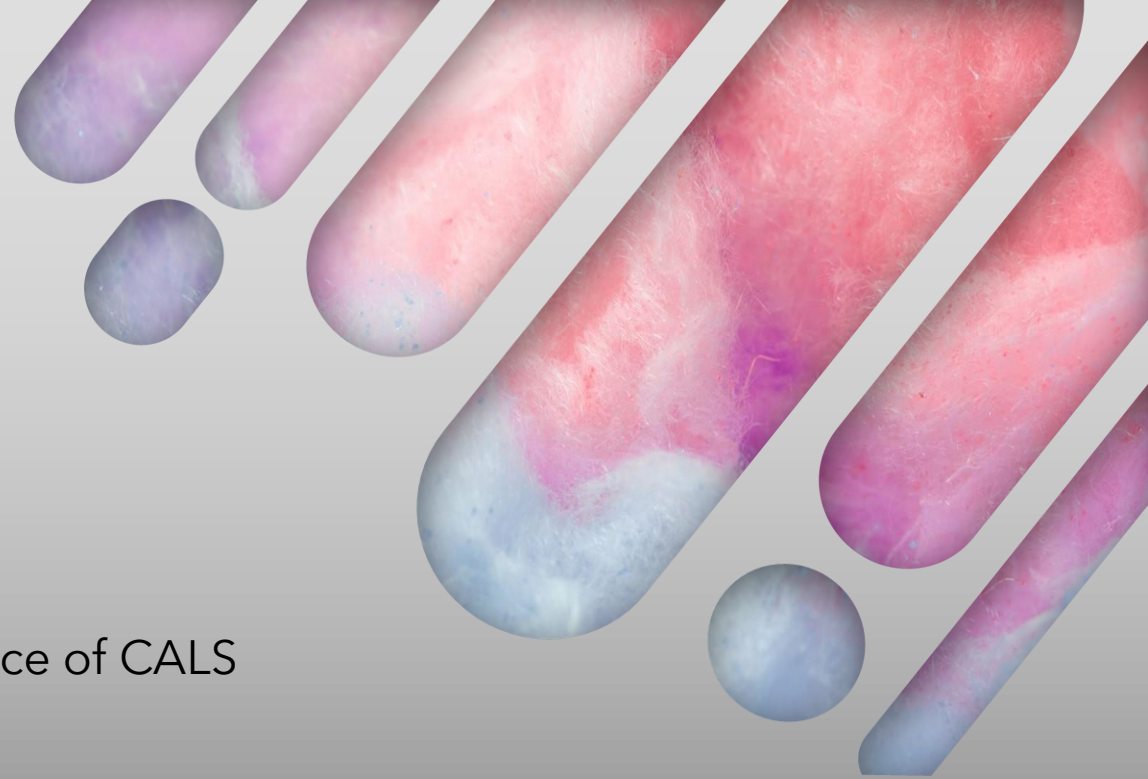


Going forward
