1	Introduction & Apologies - As above
2	Minutes and Actions not on agenda - Minutes of previous meeting held in June accepted as a true record. Actions from last meeting completed or on agenda.
3	<p>Benchmarking - the group were shown the scores submitted for the benchmarks agreed for this meeting and a discussion for each followed.</p> <p>Pressure Ulcers - Pressure ulcer scores were high across all factors. Some units needing to work on updating guidelines and training of staff.</p> <p>JP reminded the group of the National Stop the Pressure programme led by NHS Improvement. A YouTube channel is now available with videos that may be useful for critical care. Videos include how to secure ETT, TT, NGT. Follow link below. https://www.youtube.com/channel/UC0AJoyu_5kZxO1aOTItK7WA</p> <p>Both NoECCN and WYCCN are undertaking audits of pressure ulcer incidents and are sharing data with clinical teams. AR informed the group that pressure ulcer incidents on patients who had received prone therapy had been reported frequently in WY since April and shared a document from the National Stop the Pressure Programme Pressure ulcer prevention guidance when nursing patients in the prone position – May 2020. AR to circulate.</p> <p>HC offered to share the #think ahead campaign developed by LTHT, focusing on pressure ulcer prevention to the head and face.</p> <p>Prone Therapy - Prone therapy scores had improved from 2019 on those units that submitted. AR suggested taking the opportunity to ensure staff are fully up to date with Prone Therapy policies and procedures before second surge is upon us. Intensive Care Society has two guidelines available. One for Prone Positioning in Adult Critical Care and the other for Prone of the conscious patient.</p> <p>All units reported seeing an increase in prone therapy during the last few months due to COVID 19 patients. LTHT has produced Lessons Learned and are updating How to Prone video.</p>



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	<p>Renal Replacement Therapy - RRT scores - were high across all factors. Some units again needing to work on updating guidelines and training of staff.</p> <p>All units had seen more CRRT during COVID 19. Some issues with training due to companies only training on the machine and not the protocol. LD/AB spoke of the increased use of IHD within critical care units during first surge of COVID 19 due to machine availability and consumable supply issues. This is likely to be the same during a second surge. Some units will have renal teams that will deliver IHD, other units may need to rely upon critical care nurses. LD suggested implementing training sooner rather than later. There is national work been undertaken on the development of IHD competencies for critical care nurses that will sit alongside the STEP Competency Framework.</p> <p>Resume Annual Audit Calender - there was an agreement to continue with the annual audit calender. Scores to be submitted to AR for uploading on to the spread sheet. Next scores due will be as follows: September: ETT Management and TT management October: Oxygen Therapy/Humidification and Suctioning November: Weaning</p>
4	<p>Best Practice Education Tool Review</p> <p>Oxygen and Humidification Therapy - drafted by BP. Will be circulated to group for review and comments.</p> <p>Transfer - drafted by AR. Will be circulated to group for review and comments.</p> <p>ET Tube Management - AR followed up with HS at Hull but no reply as yet.</p> <p>AR informed the group that once the above are complete, each area of practice that the group benchmark will have a best practice educational tool. These may be valuable for reservists working in critical care during surge and are available on the website. https://www.wyccn.org/best-practice-education-tools.html</p> <p>There followed a discussion about other other educational resources already available for non-critical care staff who may be redeployed during the second wave of COVID19. 5	<p>Next Project Ideas - What do we want to achieve? A consensus decision made to refrain from starting any new piecies of work as a group, due to rising pressures once again around COVID 19.</p>
6	<p>AOB</p> <p>JP mentioned a Leadership course developed by an RAF/Critical Care Nurse. This course has been rolled out throughout London and has had great reviews. Aimed at junior critical care staff with the aim of providing resilience training and delegation skills.</p>



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	<p>Looking into the feasibility of a national role out. It could address some of the anxieties raised by junior nurses after the first COVID wave of supervising non critical care nurses when still junior themselves.</p> <p>JP informed the group of two workstreams of CC3N. One looking at the use of ODP's within the critical care workforce and the other looking at the role of Nursing Associates within Critical Care including competencies.</p>
